For those of you who may not be familiar with Opportunity Now, it is a day school serving 9th-12th grade students residing in 12 school districts in Central and North Central Kansas. They also bake the most delicious cookies!

Together, we decided to make those cookies a "reward" for supporting the SEF. Any school or building that had at least 10 new donors (either through payroll deduction or a one-time donation) to the Salina Education Foundation was in the running for winning cookies every month through the school year. All individual donors (current or new) were enrolled in the drawing for the cookie-of-the-month club (one dozen cookies every month). Central High School won the building cookies and Nyla Romeiser, Coronado Elementary, was the donor winner. South Middle and Schilling Elementary also had at least 10 new donors and they received cookies this month

as a thank you. We delivered 13 dozen cookies to Central High on September 19 and one dozen to Nyla Romeiser's second grade class at Coronado. Central polished off their cookies in no time (it was also Homecoming weekend) and Nyla did some "fast thinking" with her class of 17.

# Partners in Wellness

The Salina Regional Health Foundation's Community Health Investment Program will fund several SEF grants targeting Early Childhood and Healthy Lifestyles for USD 305 students. Take a look at the important projects SRHF will make possible this year:

- School nurses will be able to access four funds to help students and families: Vision Emergency, Dental Access, Respiratory Needs, and a Nurse Emergency Fund.
- A remarkable antibullying video featuring Saline County students will be shown in classrooms.
- Cottonwood preschool children and their parents will get critical health information and learn the importance of family game night.
- The Power of One/Healthy Lifestyles collaboration with middle school girls, teachers, and community women will continue.
- School social workers will have an emergency fund that can be used to help children and their families.
- Opportunity Now students will benefit from a Personal/Lifetime Fitness Class that introduces them to a variety of activities that can be done now and after they graduate.
- The last Friday in May, third grade students from 13 schools participate in Kansas Kids' Fitness Day, which is sponsored by the Kansas Department of Health and Environment. Transportation for USD 305's Title I Schools will be provided.
- Sudden Opportunity Grants targeting early childhood and health-related needs are available through the SEF for teachers, administrators, and staff. Example: physical therapists have received cube chairs for special education preschool children this year.

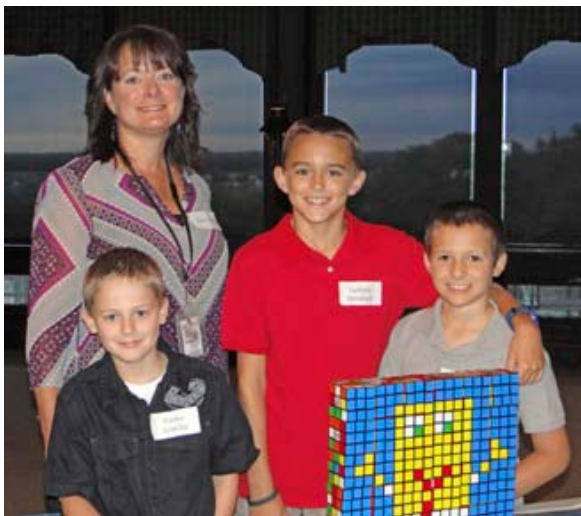
## Fall Breakfast

The Fall Breakfast is our way of thanking you, our donors, and sharing the great projects that your donations make possible. This year, 160 people enjoyed breakfast while they listened to great jazz from Ben Rohrer's Central High jazz band. The program highlighted two Outside-the-Box Grants:

Gifted teacher Kim Curtis and three of her Coronado students showcased their Rubik's Cube project by assembling a Sponge Bob right before our eyes. Kim informed the audience that one of the goals for the project is that students collaborate with each other to solve problems. Students had to learn to follow directions perfectly and deal with frustration. If one step was incorrect, they were forced to go back to the beginning step. Math concepts such as Numbers and Operations, Algebra, Geometry, and Measurement were reinforced and students were highly engaged and very determined to "solve the

cube." The three students worked together to complete the mosaic by the end of the breakfast. Great job!

Gifted teacher Barbara Livengood and science teacher Jamie Prockish along with their South Middle HAB (high altitude balloon) team shared their project, High Altitude Balloon Launch, which was a collaboration with NASA and Ft. Hays State University. The preparation for the launch took two months. A hypothesis had to be determined, payloads designed and built, and flight plans filed because the balloon crossed the path of passenger planes as it rose. Students installed GPS tracking systems and cameras. The students were interested in the freezing temperatures of liquids at high-altitudes. Their hypothesis: water will freeze

first, soda will freeze second, oil will freeze last, and the lotion will not freeze at all. They found out that the soda froze first, water second, oil third, and the lotion did not freeze.

The students and teachers launched the balloon from Ft. Hays on a bitterly cold March morning and then jumped into cars and followed the balloon using the GPS system. They traveled down dirt roads and through small towns and fields in central Kansas. They found the balloon in a field in Kanopolis, Kansas, about 200 feet from the Smoky Hill River. Gathering up the payloads, they headed back to their classroom to analyze the data. They broke Fort Hays State University's previous altitude record with 92,142 ft. To see more detailed information about the launch, the

students have developed a website: <http://smshab.weebly.com>. Check out their amazing work. The SEF is providing a grant for the students to launch another balloon this year. Lift-off is tentatively scheduled for November 14—stay tuned!

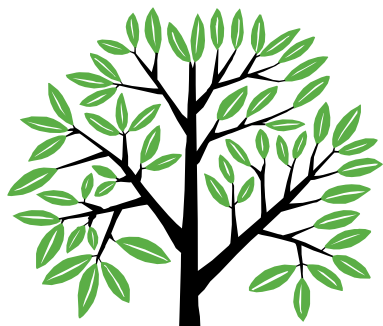
