She served three terms in the Kansas House of Representatives.

Eligibility

The Eloise Hodgson Lynch Memorial Scholarship Committee will award one \$1,000 scholarship to a graduating senior from Central High School and from South High School and one \$500 scholarship to a graduating senior from Central High School and from South High School. Students must be planning to attend full-time at a Kansas college, university, or other post-secondary institution. The awards will be made by the committee on an objective and nondiscriminatory basis. Applicants must have at least a 3.0 GPA and have demonstrated persistence, responsibility, high ideals and good character. Financial need may be considered in the committee's decision.
